The National Lottery Is.....

- The largest funder for community activities in the UK.
- Players contribute around £30 mil good causes every week.
- TNLCF distributes around £600mil across the UK per year
- In Y&H around 42.5m was awarded last year.

For Awards for All We have double the size of grant £300-£20,000 for up to 2 years.

This is the biggest change in National Lottery funding for a generation.

Reaching Communities & Partnerships

All applications should go through the website unless you have specific communication requirements.







- £300 up to £20,000 for up to 2 years (only one grant per 12-month period)
- Prioritises groups with smaller incomes
- Applications must show meaningful community involvement in planning and delivery of work
- Cannot apply to other programmes for the same project over the same period if awaiting decision

Music in hospitals and care

Applications are on-line, with 3 basic questions with a decisions typically within 16 weeks





SolCafe

RC and Partnerships

- We can fund organisations or partnerships
- Grants over £20,000, running for up to 5 years
- Can apply at any time Applications are on-line

Will fund:

- 1 Direct costs / project related costs
- 2 Organisational development
- 3 Core / fixed costs or capital

Our funding principles



Putting Communities First

Ensuring the people you work with are in the lead of finding solutions to problems in their community, ensuring the people are meaningfully involved in the development, design and delivery of your work.

Strengths based

Supporting people and communities to build on the knowledge, skills and experience they already have to make the changes they want.

Connected

Demonstrating a good understanding of other activities and services in the community and showing how your proposal will complement these.



Who can apply?



You can apply if your

Registered charity

Constituted voluntary or community organisation

Not-for-profit company or CIC

Local authority, council or school

We can't Fund

Individuals or sole traders

Companies who pay profits to directors, shareholders

based outside the UK

One organisation applying on behalf of another

If there are less than 2 independent trustees or directors

Not married, civil partnership, long-term relationship, living at the same address, or related by blood

- 3. Where your work will take place
- 4. How your community helped shape this idea
- 5. How it fits with local activities
- 6. Who will benefit & difference you'll make
- 7. How much money you need & what you'll spend it on
- 8. How long you need the money for





Safeguarding



If you work with adults or children at risk, you will need a safeguarding policy to show how you intend to protect them.

The NSPCC have lots of <u>helpful advice</u> about setting Up and following good child safeguarding policies.

NCVO also host a number of <u>safeguarding</u> <u>resources</u>.

If we do fund your organisation, you must comply with <u>our safeguarding</u> <u>policy.</u>
