3. Speaker Jo Kent Humber Wellbeing Hub -Blossom

- Jo Kent gave a brief on her career history and a brief on the project and how it started during Covid at a portacabin at the Humber Bridge.
- Jo was supported by volunteers
- The service came about as individuals who attempt suicide go to A& E then discharged to GP and then no other support, and those who self-harm has no services to support them.
- Blossom came about to support individuals who have no other support, we work with the Ellesmere Centre & Humber Referral College and support individuals and their families.
- We are seeking funding as the service is run by 3 staff for 6 days a week.
- Blossom is not a crisis service people can come and talk and occupy their minds with crafts and a place where they feel safe and at ease.
- We support a lot of Children and Young People with arts, crafts, games and a silent book club.
- More importantly if you want to know why I do what I do? It is because I don't
 want to see people go through what they go through after a loss of a friend or
 family member.
- We will be holding Festival of Hope which will be held on World Suicide Day 10/9/25. It will be a 5-day event and would like all stakeholders to take part. Look out for further information.

4. Speaker Matt Fawcett Get Hull Active

- Matt Fawcett Public Heath lead discussed the Get Hull Active project.
- The project through Sports England has been given to 140 places working at place and our place is Hull
- It is not about being sporty it is about getting people moving and addressing health inequalities.
- Sports England are promoting a shift change and promoting opportunity to get people moving more and not in a sporty way.
- Hull is becoming more sedentary and over time has become more inactive.
- We have demonstrated to Sport England we can do this.
- We have already started getting an insight and have worked with Forum, Street Games and already have engaged with over 1000 people.
- We want the changes that are implemented to last and would really appreciate your support.
- We have questionnaires here with us and will have SAE soon. Please take
 the questionnaires and share. We will come and collect them from you until
 we get the SAE.
